



PARKS AND RECREATION – POOL LIFEGUARD / INSTRUCTOR

The City of Newport is currently recruiting for reliable, dependable and motivated individuals to fill the position of Lifeguard / Instructor at our Parks and Recreation Pool facility. This is a regular part-time (less than 20 hours per week), non-exempt position with an hourly rate of pay of \$10.38/hour - \$13.67/hour for the Lifeguard position, and \$11.44/hour - \$15.07/hour for the Instructor position. Placement in the salary ranges will be based on skills, experience, training, and education of the person hired.

We encourage applicants of all ages to apply (must at least be 15 years of age).

If you are looking for a career change, this may be the job for you!

This position is responsible for maintaining safe swimming conditions in the pool, deck, and surrounding areas. creates a safe and positive atmosphere that promotes safety and participation in accordance with City of Newport policies and procedures; Perform other duties as they pertain to the position; including but not limited to office/reception duties, cleaning/janitorial duties, water chemistry checks, inventory stocking.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Applicants must be a minimum of 15 years of age to be considered for employment.
2. Must be able to obtain the following certifications within 3 months of hire: CPR for the Professional Rescuer, AED, and Basic First Aid certification. Current Red Cross Lifeguarding. (The City of Newport will provide these trainings and certifications)
3. Must be available to work a varied work schedule, including some weekends, early mornings and evenings. Consideration may be made to accommodate work/school schedules, however the City may require specific hours be worked in order to meet customer service demands.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

1. Ability to pass lifeguard water test.
2. Must be able to remain alert.
3. Must be able to sit or stand for extended periods.
4. Adequate ability to hear noises and distinguish distress signals.
5. Ability to continuously scan all areas of the pool with clear vision.
6. Ability to perform strenuous physical tasks necessary for a water rescue.
7. Ability to communicate verbally, including projecting voice across distance in normal and loud situations.
8. Lifting, pulling, and carrying up to 50 pounds.
