Oregon Arbor Week Booster Grant Agreement

This Agreement is between Oregon Community Trees (OCT), a non-profit professional organization, and the Tree City USA (City) designated below. The mission of OCT is to promote healthy urban and community forests through leadership, education, awareness, and advocacy. We assist community groups, local governments and schools with our expertise to promote urban and community forestry, an often overlooked and very valuable resource that cost-effectively protects Oregonian's quality of life.

OCT's Oregon Arbor Week Booster Grant funds are to be used to celebrate Oregon Arbor Week in your community. Funds shall be used as outlined in your grant application or otherwise approved by Oregon Community Trees based on subsequent correspondence and additional information you provided OCT.

Distribution of Funds by OCT to Grant Recipient

Funds will be available immediately following signature by both parties to this Agreement, and will be mailed to the project coordinator (unless another recipient is designated by the City in writing).

Requirements of the Grantee at the End of the Project

By May 15, 2020 grantees must provide OCT with documentation (a written description) of how funds were spent, approximately how many actual participants attended your event and how OCT was recognized, along with digital photographs or videos of your event – preferably of people using, enjoying or participating in the celebration. These images and the information provided on the application will be used to promote the grantees' Tree City USA and the Arbor Week Booster Grant Program via OCT's website and annual conference. Permission for OCT to use the material in this way shall be automatically granted on acceptance of the award, and it shall be the City's responsibility to obtain any necessary permission when taking the required photos or videos.

Requirement to Use OCT Logo

OCT also requires that the grant recipient display the OCT logo on any materials (printed materials, banners, t-shirts, etc.) produced with grant funds. OCT will supply electronic copies of the logo to each grant recipient. OCT also requires the attribution of OCT grant funding in any press release relating to the City's Arbor Week project. Please include the statement "This project is supported with funding from Oregon Community Trees."

Changes to the Grant Project

Oregon Arbor Week Booster Grant Application Form 2020



What We Do

The mission of <u>Oregon Community Trees</u> (OCT) is to promote healthy urban and community forests through leadership, education, awareness and advocacy. We assist community groups, local governments and schools with our expertise to support urban and community forestry, an often overlooked and very valuable resource that cost-effectively enhances every Oregonian's quality of life.

Eligibility

Oregon Community Trees is offering grants of up to \$500 each to at least four <u>Tree City USA</u> (TCUSA) communities that have been designated for at least one year to enrich Oregon Arbor Week celebrations during April. Communities that received the award in 2019 are not eligible for a grant this year, but keep those great ideas for next year!

Why Oregon Tree Cities?

The national Tree City USA program requires an annual recertification effort that includes an Arbor Day celebration. OCT supports Oregon Tree Cities in these efforts. Since 2014, OCT has provided grants to 29 different Oregon TCUSA cities worth over \$15,000.

 - Electronic submissions of the PDF form are preferred. Responses may also be provided in the body of an email or a Word document; please number responses 1-19 to match the application form.
 - After their Arbor Week or Arbor Day celebration, grant recipients must provide OCT with documentation of how funds were spent with digital photographs or videos of the activity—preferably with people participating in the celebration. These images, and information provided on this application, will be used to promote the grant recipient's TCUSA as well as OCT's Arbor Week Booster Grant program on our website and at our annual conference.
 - Permission for OCT to use the material in this way shall be automatically granted by the grant recipient on acceptance of the award, and it shall be the grant recipient's responsibility to obtain any necessary permission when taking the required photographs or videos.

Use of Funds

All funds are to be used to celebrate Oregon Arbor Week in your community. Funds can be used for a one-time use or event, or to purchase items that can be used for celebrations again and again. Some ideas for the using the grant include:

- To support a community tree planting activity.
- To support a school tree planting activity with children.
- To purchase tree-related books for the local library.
- To create banners or other signage.
- To create a portable, hands-on activity station.
- To purchase and plant trees (proper tree planting instructions can be provided to you, upon request).
- To purchase tree planting tools.
- To create an award or plaque for citizens or volunteers.
- To purchase shirts, hats, vests or supplies for volunteers.
- To purchase a reusable canopy for outdoor events.
- To purchase prizes for local poster or writing contests.
- To support a community training event or produce creative community outreach materials.

Please acknowledge OCT at your event by publicizing *This project is supported with funding from Oregon Community Trees.* We also ask that the OCT logo be displayed if your project includes printed materials or a website. Digital files will be provided for your use.

Criteria Used to Evaluate Proposals

Preference will be given to proposals that meet the following criteria:

- Cost effectiveness and project feasibility;
- Education and/or outreach is incorporated to raise awareness and build support for community trees;
- Interdisciplinary approach that incorporates elements of diversity, creativity and science; and
- Events or materials will be placed in a prominent space that the community residents see or visit regularly.

11. Describe your proposed project or event:

The Parks & Recreation department (P&R) will erect a canopy outside of the local Library or Coastal Park (depending on the weather) to attract community members. The canopy will be staffed by P&R representatives, along with local tree experts. We will have seedlings available for planting, along with publications from the Arbor Day foundation, and tree "facts and figures" handouts. Kids will have a chance to color leaves of various trees and learn about the importance trees have in our lives. New "tree books" will be prominently displayed in the library along with posters, to highlight the event. This event will be well-advertised in local media and will be the start of a new annual celebration and community outreach.

13. How will an OCT grant "boost" your community's Arbor Week or Arbor Day project or event?

The City of Newport has always had very small "celebrations" for Arbor Day and we would like to take a big step forward and make this an annual community event. Funds will be used to purchase seedlings and publications through the Arbor Day Foundation for distribution to the public, and along with that, we will order several new books for the library pertaining to the information of, and importance of trees (for various ages.) The books will assist in creating community-wide participation in the event, as the library will assist in the advertising as well, which will start the process of developing partnerships and involvement for the annual celebration.

14. What key groups or partners have committed to working on this project or event with you? Local arborist Anita Albrecht, and the Newport Public Library.

15. How will the funds be used cost-effectively?

The Parks & Recreation department will provide staff, advertising, and hand-outs for the event. OCT funds will be used specifically to provide information and seedlings to the public, with other costs being covered by the Parks & Recreation Department.

Having the library as a partner adds to the significance of the event, acknowledging that information about trees can be found year-round in our town.


