Title: Teen Internship Grant with the State Library of Oregon Memorandum of Understanding

<u>Recommended Motion</u>: I move to ratify the City Manager's approval to sign the Memorandum of Understanding between the State Library of Oregon and the Newport Public Library as the authorized City of Newport official.

Background Information:

This memorandum of understanding between the State Library of Oregon (State Library) and the Newport Public Library regarding the use of Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) funds for FY2022 (Federal Award Number LS-252480-OLS-22, CFDA No. 45.310). This memorandum shall become effective upon signature by the authorized officials from each entity and will expire on October 31, 2023.

The State Library of Oregon is directing up to \$2,500.00 from the federal Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) grant, granted to the State Library by the Institute of Museum and Library Services on April 8, 2022, as a subgrant to Newport Public Library for the direct purpose of this memorandum.

The grant would provide an opportunity for a local high school student to learn about professional library work. Teen interns will increase skills working on a connected learning project. They will also more fully understand the scope of library work and be able to identify how their interests and skills match that work. Library mentors will develop leadership, communication, and coaching skills. The Newport Public Library will better understand how to engage and support students while also creating career and programmatic pathways to increase diversity in the field. Also, the Newport Public Library has a number of programs during the summer and a teen intern would provide some much-needed assistance.

The Newport Public Library will share successes, challenges, opportunities within the Library, to community stakeholders, and with other libraries receiving this grant.

The Newport Public Library received a teen internship grant in 2022 from the State Library of Oregon. This is the second year the Newport Public Library has received a teen internship grant.

<u>Fiscal Notes:</u> The cost for hiring the teen intern for the 3 months, would be covered by the grant funds allocated by the State Library of Oregon. The State Library of Oregon is directing up to \$2,500.00 for wages and supplies needed for the intern.
