RESOLUTION NO. 3909

**ADOPTING DESIGN STANDARDS AND FEES FOR PERMITTING
SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES IN RIGHTS-OF-WAY**

WHEREAS, the City of Newport adopted Ordinance No. 2176, establishing permitting requirements for the deployment of small wireless facilities within rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance aligns with model language developed by the League of Oregon Cities (“LOC”) that is to be applied in concert with a set of design standards; and

WHEREAS, the Newport Planning Commission, in recommending the City Council adopt Ordinance No. 2176, did review the LOC model design standards and supports their application in order to ensure that placement of small wireless facilities complements other established uses within rights-of-way; and


WHEREAS, city staff will be called upon to implement the permitting process and apply the design standards and it is appropriate that the City recover a portion of those costs through the imposition of a permit filing fee; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission has established “safe harbor” limits on the fees local governments can charge, and the amount set forth in this resolution is consistent with the safe harbor limits.

THE CITY OF NEWPORT RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:


1. The City of Newport adopts the *Small Wireless Facility Design Standards, dated February 2021, and attached as Exhibit A to this resolution*; and
2. A permit fee of \$100 is hereby established for each small wireless facility to be deployed in rights-of-way; and
3. The fee established herein shall be reviewed annually and adjusted as needed to account for inflation using the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers.
4. This resolution shall be effective on the date Ordinance No. 2176 takes effect.
