

Our Valley What's Next/Nuestro Valle Que Sigue is pleased to present the first look at our community's vision for the future. With input from thousands of people across the region, this vision reflects a collaborative and values-based approach toward improving this place we call home for years to come.

Our Valley What's Next is a nonpartisan community-based planning project meant to sustain and revitalize our communities and to get ahead of change. Community leaders and citizens have come together with the goal of developing a long-range vision and action plan for our region.

This is the first time such an initiative has been undertaken across multi-jurisdictional boundaries in Chelan and Douglas counties. The name, Our Valley, was chosen to reflect this approach. We are supported by numerous businesses and civic, government and nonprofit leaders.

To get a better sense of Our Valley's strengths, aspirations and challenges, we initiated a conversation with community members in 2015. Through interviews, surveys, presentations, open houses, traditional media and social media, we engaged tens of thousands of people, including those less inclined to participate in community planning.

This outreach effort allowed us to develop 28 initial strategies to move us in the direction of an action plan. For a closer look, see the rest of this booklet. Community-based Action Teams, formed around six themes, will flesh out and further detail these strategies in 2016.

## LAND USE, TRANSPORTATION, GROWTH + DEVELOPMENT

OUR VALLEY plans for future growth and development by linking jobs, housing, transportation and public amenities to create more livable communities that offer a high quality of life and improved well-being. Working with innovative approaches to planning and urban development, we revitalize our downtown areas, develop local "mixed-use" districts where people live, work and play, enhance our region's transportation system with improved connectivity, public transit and alternative modes of travel, and develop new and more affordable housing options that support our growing population and working families.

## MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

Plan for, design and promote "mixed-use" development in Our Valley's urban centers, encouraging thoughtful integration of residential, commercial, employment, and cultural activities in areas that support increased public transit use, cycling and pedestrian activity.

## **COMPREHENSIVE AFFORDABLE HOUSING STRATEGY**

Develop a comprehensive affordable housing strategy for Our Valley, addressing all aspects of the region's housing affordability challenge, including housing supplies and costs, rental vacancies and rents, subsidized housing and housing assistance programs, senior housing, and homelessness and transitional housing.

## **URBAN DEVELOPMENT & REDEVELOPMENT PROJECTS**

Accelerate development and redevelopment in Our Valley's downtowns and urbanized areas, combining housing, jobs, retail and entertainment, attracting new residents, workers, younger adults and visitors.



## **COMPREHENSIVE INTEGRATED TRANSPORTATION PLANNING**

Take steps to enhance the traveling experience for the community by integrating land-use planning and guality-of-life factors to help shape and improve our transportation system, by seeking out innovative approaches to transportation, and by meeting the desires of residents and visitors for alternative modes of travel.


