




NEWPORT VISION 2040 COMMUNITY INPUT Summary Document of Phase II Survey Data

Diversity of opinion is good, but in a small town environment, diversity is often discouraged, despite the claims to the contrary in this core value statement. Greater Newport Area Vision 2040




